International Council Update (John Miller, International Council President) – Happy Valentine's Day! Well, we do associate Valentine's Day with Love. As such, it is fitting that we also celebrate this month, remembering that our motto is "Listen-Listen-Love-Love." Have you ever stopped to think about how important our being in the prisons is to the incarcerated? Sometimes those folks-men, women, teens, and children-have not heard from their families, loved ones, or friends for weeks, months, years, or never! Oh, and don't forget the loved ones of the incarcerated. How lonely they must be, in some cases, not to be able to visit their loved ones. But we, as a group, are able to help bridge that gap of loneliness by showing the love of Christ to the incarcerated and the loved ones of the incarcerated. When you go for Weekend events, remember you are that bridge over the gap of loneliness and hopelessness. Our guests are looking for hope and love. We show them that love and hope in what we say and do. Our actions will speak louder than any shout, not only to the incarcerated and the loved ones of the incarcerated, but also to the officers and staff of the facilities. So the next time you go into the prison, or the next time you have an "Outside" gathering, remember our motto, "Listen-Listen-Love-Love." It may be the only time our guests will experience it and know someone cares.

Men's Ministry Update (Ken Rocks, Men's Ministry Coordinator) – As you make plans for the upcoming year, keep Advanced Kairos Training (AKT) in mind. Why? If you are selected as a future Weekend leader, your Advisory Council will make a \$200 to \$400 investment in your training to become a leader. That investment should include a good return when you follow the Ezra software program for the full 6 months it is designed to guide you.

AKT takes place over a Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. We require the training to take place 12-24 months prior to your Weekend. That way, you can make room in your life for the commitment the role requires, and you can spiritually prepare yourself for your primary role as Weekend leader. That responsibility is the spiritual formation of the team. By fully preparing yourself and the team for the servant leadership role you take as Weekend leader, you will be able to give glory to Christ for the success the Weekend brings.

Women's Ministry Update (Gina Brockmeyer, Women's Ministry Coordinator) – Recently, I have heard from several Kairos Outside Advisory Councils who have asked me about Advisory Council chairs being tapped for their leadership track. If you are serving as the chair of your local Advisory Council, you should not be in the leadership track.

Why? The Advisory Council chair is responsible for leading her local Advisory Council. This means the chair ensures the operations of the ministry are conducted properly and fully carried out in compliance with current State Chapter Committee and Kairos Prison Ministry International, Inc. policies and procedures. The chair is also responsible for making sure that Weekend leaders are properly identified and trained, and the chair must see that team formation meetings are taking place and volunteers are attending. In other words, the Advisory Council chair is charged with making sure the Weekend leaders are doing their job. So, if the Advisory Council chair is in the leadership track, there can be a potential conflict of interest if an Advisory Council or an Advisory Council chair has to address an issue with an upcoming Weekend leader or leaders.

Once a chair concludes her term as the Advisory Council chair, she is free to step into the leadership track.

Kairos Torch Update (Kevin Resnover, Youth Ministries Coordinator) – The Kairos Torch Weekend is an extremely powerful experience for any youth in attendance, but the mentoring component can be life changing:

At its most rudimentary level, mentoring benefits the mentee because it assures a young person that there is someone who cares about them. The youth is not alone in dealing with incarceration and the day-to-day challenges of life. Kairos Torch has recorded many successful mentor/mentee connections that have brought about positive change in the life of the youth and within the facility they are housed:

- Support with day-to-day living for incarcerated youth.
- Mentors help improve a young person's self-esteem.
- Mentors teach young people how to relate well to all kinds of people and help them strengthen communication skills.
- Mentors help direct youth toward self-identity, self-discovery, and self-understanding.
- Mentors help their mentee formulate a plan for their lives by identifying short- and long-term goals and creating a plan to reach those goals.

Several studies have shown a correlation between a young person's involvement in a quality mentoring relationship and positive outcomes in the areas of school, mental health, problem behavior, and health. (DuBois & Karcher, 2005; Rhodes, 2002; Zimmerman, Bingenheimer & Behrendt, 2005)
