Board of Directors Update (Vicki Spurgeon, Board Chair)

In April the Board of Directors met over three days to learn, share, and grow as one body striving

to do the will of our Lord for Kairos. Spiritual health and growth remains a primary focus of the Board as we realize we must be spiritually healthy as individuals to be a spiritually healthy group. Twice daily group devotional, reflection, and prayer times were a highlight for us. We also interacted with all of the Kairos staff as we shared lunch, conversation, and laughter. Additionally, we prayed for each staff member and the work they do to bring glory to God. Time was spent hearing from the Program Coordinators, learning about financial reports from the Controller, and receiving information from the CEO.

We also received and approved a recommendation from the Foundation Board to streamline activities and incorporate the functions of the Foundation into Kairos and adopted a Gift Acceptance Policy they had previously reviewed and adopted in the fall. We had conversation about our Board roles and the role of the CEO and staff in an organization operating in a governing board model. As we considered our fundraising responsibilities as a Board, we also discussed Board expenses and how to best handle those moving forward.

Men's Ministry Update (Craig Combs, Men's Ministry Coordinator)

I want to thank all of you for the warmth and support I have received since I walked through the door March 29th to start this new adventure. I look forward to supporting and helping you in your Kairos Ministry as we pray and talk together. It is amazing how quickly God can change the course of your life and use a lot of experiences and events that He wove into the fabric of your life when you weren't watching or really noticing—just ask me, and I will tell you the story!

We are in the midst of doing Weekends all over the world. As Weekend Leaders, teams, and Advisory Councils are taking care of the last-minute details for each of these Weekends, they all need to be mindful and remind volunteers that they are ***always*** guests in the Warden's house.

The Warden has the authority to set the rules for his or her house, and as Kairos volunteers we should not resist or complain about the institution's rules and regulations. If volunteers don't explicitly follow the rules and regulations of the institutions where they serve, they are not only putting themselves in jeopardy of not being invited back into the institution to serve, but they are also putting Kairos in jeopardy of not being invited back to the institution! Volunteers must all realize and accept that the first concern of the institutions is security. Weekend Leaders must be constantly aware of the activities of every member of their team throughout the Weekend, and sensitive to any action by a team member individually, or the group as a whole, that violates the rules and regulations of the institution or might do harm to Kairos' relationship with the institution.

One of the ways that experienced team members get into trouble is that they become so familiar and comfortable with the ministry that they slowly forget about obedience. "They" know what to do and what can be done. The rules are for someone else. We must all be mindful, because sooner or later the loss of an obedient spirit may catch up with individuals and they may find themselves being removed from participation in the ministry.

The Kairos life is one of learning to lay down our will and to joyfully serve in obedience. It starts with Christ, and extends to prison authorities and the methods of Kairos.

Kairos Torch Update (Kevin Resnover, Youth Ministry Coordinator)

Lite n' Lively activities are a very important element on the Kairos Torch Weekend. The youthful Participants will typically have short attention spans, be full of energy, and be eager to participate in fun activities. The Lite n' Lively activities listed in the program manual are designed with these facts in mind and when properly executed can meet those needs and add to the development of the Participants' concept of teamwork, self-esteem, and other life-management skills. These activities can also be an opportunity to present biblical concepts in a subtle, non-threatening way. Having fun while learning is a great combination for hurting youth.
