Board of Directors Update (Terry Crockett, Board Chair)

The Board of Directors had our Spring Retreat on April 19-21 in the Kairos office in DeBary with the theme of “Be The Light”. We started on Thursday night with a devotional and spiritual exercise led by

Pastor Eugene Smith from City Church of Orlando. Receive the light of Jesus Christ and reflect His light to others.

CEO Evelyn Lemly gave the Board a “State of the Ministry” followed by presentations from the Program Coordinators. The Board received their annual presentation from Cornerstone Management regarding the ministry’s investments, which was very positive.

The CEO discussed with the Board the Vision Priorities for the 2019-2023 Strategic Plan, and the Board passed 7 Vision Priorities for Kairos. The Board passed nominations for the Board of Directors to be voted on by the International Council at the Annual Conference. The Board went into Executive Session to discuss the CEO’s evaluation; which was presented to her later in the day.

The ministry of Kairos has, and is, showing the light in many dark areas. Praise God! Thank you for being His light in all areas of the ministry. We are looking forward to the Annual Conference and seeing many of you.

International Council Update (Tom McCarty, International Council President)

Like many representative-based organizations, much of the work of the International Council (IC) is done in committees and subcommittees. In the proverbial nutshell, here is what they do (based on each one’s charter).

VOLUNTEER AND GUEST RECRUITMENT- Develop a catalog of “Best Practices” for outreach and recruitment of new volunteers and give it the widest distribution possible. Also, monitor the effectiveness of the various methods and revise the catalog accordingly.

PROGRAM EXCELLENCE - Evaluate the effectiveness and compliance of Kairos ministry programs.

COMMUNICATIONS - Assess ministry internal communications, study potential improvements, advocate for new communications capabilities, and provide a resource to the Chief Executive Officer, Board of Directors and International Council.

MINISTRY COORDINATION - Monitor the implementation and integration of the various Kairos program elements consistent with the manuals and policies of Kairos, Review program changes proposed by the staff and make recommendations for changes to the program elements to the staff.

KAIROS INSIDE - Assist the Ministry Coordination Committee to meet its responsibilities specifically with respect to the ministry in adult prisons.

KAIROS OUTSIDE - Assist the Ministry Coordination Committee to meet its responsibilities specifically with respect to the ministry in adult prisons.

KAIROS TORCH - Assist the Ministry Coordination Committee to meet its responsibilities specifically with respect to the ministry in youth correctional (detention, treatment, or other facility where youth are remanded for correction of behavior) facilities.

- All committee meetings are open to all Kairos volunteers.

Recruiting Ideas (Bob Williams, Ohio recruiting coordinator and Steve Becker, Ohio International Council representative)

We should always look for the opportunity to share Jesus and what he is doing through the Kairos ministry. For when we share Jesus in this way, we are actually recruiting volunteers for Kairos. For instance, I generally have one of the multi-colored, three-fold Kairos brochures with me. It is a valuable tool. I enjoy offering it to anyone that I can. Most people readily accept it. I offer a few kind words with it and may even ask to have coffee and chat a bit over Kairos. This may not lead to securing a volunteer each time, but it does raise awareness about an opportunity to serve God in his kingdom-building.

Dear Kairos community, we are all recruiters for Jesus in what he can do through Kairos. We have our testimonies in what we have seen and how we have been changed while serving in Kairos. This has proven to be a remarkable way to make disciples. It is amazing how Jesus transforms lives...even on the inside of the institutions.

This ministry has been fruitful for many, many years. One can witness changed hearts at Weekend closing programs. Changed hearts also occur during Weekend team formation meetings. They get changed at weekly Prayer & Share meetings, at Retreats, and at Reunions. Jesus works on the hearts of all involved...residents, institution staff personnel, inside and outside volunteers. And what a wonderful way to build life-long bonds with other volunteers...volunteers who come from various churches and denominations...all coming together to share and demonstrate the love of Jesus.

Your boldness to reach out and share can be the key that opens the door for another person to become part of the Kairos community. When each Advisory Council and each Weekend team takes the initiative to share Jesus and recruit, the entire ministry will be blessed. It can be better postured to have Jesus and Kairos in each and every institution allowed for a long time to come.

Granted, recruiting can have its ups and down, peaks and valleys. But please remember, we are only the sowers and waterers. God does the harvesting. And as you pray and reflect upon your participation in recruiting, please ponder on why you serve in Kairos and what blessings you have received by serving faithfully. Would someone else you know be thankful for those same blessings?

Men's Ministry Update (Craig Combs, Men's Ministry Coordinator)

I would be remiss if I didn't shout it from the mountaintops that the first ever Kairos Weekend in Nebraska was held April 19- 22! As they recounted the history, I found out this has been in the works for about 12 years. *"Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance. And let endurance have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing."* James 1:2-4

Blessed Are The Flexible For They Will Not Be Bent Out Of Shape

A dear friend of mine quotes this phrase often. I laugh every time I hear it. But over the years, and the longer I am involved with Kairos, the more I appreciate these words. They remind me of God's faithfulness in every circumstance.

Serving in Kairos requires flexibility. If we are serving on Kairos Inside Weekends or Kairos Torch Weekends, I am sure you know what I mean. We serve in the Warden's house – we are there at the institution's pleasure – we must do what they ask and follow their rules...rules we may not always understand, and rules that may change frequently over the course of a Weekend. And while Kairos Outside does not deal with many of the issues found in correctional institutions, the communities deal with many situations that require flexibility.

Flexibility is a sign of our willingness to trust God with situations, and outcomes. Flexibility is a sign of obedience and surrender to God, and flexibility lowers the stress we feel when something is out of our control. I believe God stretches all of us as we serve in Kairos, and in our personal lives, because He wants to strengthen our trust in Him.

Remember nothing that surprises you surprises God. He is in complete control!

After two years of discussion and preparation, the Edgecombe Youth Development Center in North Carolina has invited Kairos Torch into their facility to mentor and minister to the youth housed there.
