

In 2019 we began working with our updated Kairos five year strategic plan which is a continuation of the past 5 years work and impact. Our goal is to continually evaluate the current environment and take steps forward to carry out our mission. We have come up with seven vision priorities to keep us focused on and develop plans to enhance our ministry daily. After all we strive to serve the Lord by giving him our very best daily.

The vision priorities include: spiritual health, recruitment and retention of volunteers, strategic growth and impact of the ministry, communications, healthy operations at all levels, training, and international growth as feasible.

Kairos first vision priority is Spiritual Health. We must be healthy ourselves in order to share the transforming love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ with others. We also need to be unified as a body of Christ as we operate as individuals and as teams. We recognize if we do not focus on our own identity in Christ then all of the other priorities will not be successful. So please ensure that in all meetings, we are praying, doing devotions, seeking the Lord's directions first and foremost. And remember if a conflict occurs to turn it over to the Lord and pray together.

I encourage you to read the strategic plan that is on MyKairos.org and be familiar with what we are striving to do as a ministry. Also, the States have been asked to ensure they have a State plan that includes: recruitment, funding, needs of current ministry, growth of new ministry/new stars, and leadership development. These plans, along with a focus on spiritual health, will help provide direction and intent for the state based on their current situations.

As Kairos grows in the US, we are always interested in new opportunities. These may include new states, new Advisory Council locations, adding multiple yards in the same prison, having all three programs running in the state, and adding more Federal prisons. We are also focused on working to connect the three programs for individual and family impact as we know the programs are 'Better Together'. If the man, woman, or youth attend Kairos on the inside and the woman of the incarcerated attend on the outside, we can have even more impact on the family unity and reconciliation. This also has a stronger impact on the reentry and recidivism of the person.

Over the past years, we have been working to solidify and enhance our ministry in the US and the nine International Countries we currently operate. Much work has been done thanks to the wonderful volunteers across the world.

In the future, we are prayerfully reviewing the opportunity to grow into new International countries also. There is much foundational work to accomplish to set up new countries to ensure their long term survival and to form an infrastructure that is viable for Kairos.

I recently represented Kairos in a Correctional Ministry and Chaplains Association Pastors training in prison ministry in Liberia. I can honestly say that was not a country I had on my radar for Kairos but there was a lot interest from several African Countries in attendance. It was a wonderful conference. I had the opportunity to visit a prison, meet with the Ministry of Justice leaders, prison leaders, chaplaincy leaders, and others.

This helped a few of the countries to understand the prison situations and potential opportunities for Kairos in the future. Please pray for God's leading as we explore new countries for Kairos in the next few years. As Kairos, we need local leadership so if you know people in other countries please let me know and we can explore those opportunities.

Are You Training for Service during Team Formation Meetings?

Happy Spring! To be honest, my body hasn't adjusted to the springing ahead of the clock. You would think I would be used to doing this... after all we do it every year. Then we complain of the change to the way it was when we fall back to the way it was! Why is change so difficult? It isn't like we never experience change, as we do every day. We have a lot of practice changing and we still haven't gotten good at it!

Kairos is a wonderful study of something remaining the same and yet always changing. How is that even possible? The Kairos Inside Weekend schedule and components haven't really changed since 2011. There have been changes in how things are done- for example the Leadership Track which helps folks have more experience before leading a Kairos Weekend. Going to Advanced Kairos Training before being an Observing Leader was a great change with a nice dividend. The

Excellence Initiative isn't new, but it changed and is now entered on-line.

Every Kairos Weekend is the same, yet each is very different. Right? I think it is wonderful that due to the make up of the team, the Weekend is different -yet the same. Here is the kicker- folks who don't like change seem to be the same folks that say that the Team Formation meetings are repetitive and they have heard it all and don't need to attend. So here is my challenge: the Riverbanks for Team Formation are wide, so why don't we spend time training the same topics, but do it differently? Think how can you present something so it is fresh, new and interesting, so folks will pay attention, and so the team will realize they don't know it all, but just feel that way since they have indeed heard the same thing the same way many times. Plan for activities so team members can get to know veterans and new folks in meaningful ways. Make sure you expend the effort to really get to know some folks that you don't know. Plan for several people to oversee training topics and give them freedom to experiment how to present the needed topics in new ways. Instead of having 5 or 6 meetings, perhaps an overnight meeting would give extra time for people to get to know each other better and contain enough hours to get you to the 34-36 hours with one less meeting.

One other thing that is the same but is done differently is how the Weekend Leader's report is captured. It is important when the Weekend is completed, and when the Leader has made the changes to the team and the participant list in Ezra that they do two things. First, create the Weekend Leader Report by just clicking the "Leader's Report" blue button on the right of the Ezra main page. After you make your comments and save the document there is a second step. While connected to the internet (important), click the blue button on the right of the Ezra main page that says 'Copy Files for Next Leader'. You will have to plug in the USB Thumb drive that came in your Ezra box to do this. When completed it will tell you it was a success. This step creates the file to give to the next Weekend Leader and it also uploads your report into KairosMessenger.

KairosMessenger is the database that your Advisory Council and State Committee can access for information. When you have several Weekends of data in the database, you will find that it will be a treasure trove for recruiting volunteers who have slipped through the cracks and don't serve anymore and you can look here and go back to them and ask if they would serve again.

Please enjoy the Spring campaign of Kairos Weekends and as you serve, please notice that indeed it is an interesting mix change while remaining the same.

2019 Kairos Outside Future Weekend Leaders (Australia)

For the past 17 days I have had the privilege of traveling throughout Australia with Jenny Bothma the Program Support and Development Group coordinator for Kairos Outside for Women in Australia. We trained and visited with Future Weekend Leaders, Observing Leaders, Advising Leaders, Regional Committee Members, Chaplains, members of the Australian Program Support and Development Group, a member of the Ezra Support Group, the staff of the Kairos Support Office in Australia, members of the Australian Board of Directors, and volunteers from the states of Queensland, New South Wales, the Australian Capital Territory, South Australia, and Western Australia.



Three Advanced Kairos trainings were conducted over the 17 days including one in Brisbane, one in Atherton, and one in Sydney. Two “Train the Trainer” events were also held in Brisbane and in Sydney. Over 75 ladies attended the Advance Kairos Training for Kairos Outside, and 20 received training so that they may be called upon in the future to lead Advance Kairos Training for Kairos Outside in Australia and to help the Program Support and Development Group. All the active Kairos Outside communities in Australia were represented at the trainings, and the trip was an amazing time of learning, sharing, and provided us all with an amazing opportunity to truly understand and see firsthand the global impact of Kairos as we spread the transforming love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ to the incarcerated and those impacted by incarceration.

While the primary purpose of my trip was to provide training for the Kairos Outside ladies, I also had the privilege of visiting Emu Plains Correctional Centre for women, visiting with a team who was conducting a short-course (Weekend) at John Morony Correctional Centre for men, and to meet with Ken Moore and David Beck, the past and current coordinators for Kairos Inside who serve on the Program Support and Development Group, Bob Joyce of the Ezra Support Group in Australia, and Bruce Bond and Derek Cornelius of the Kairos Support Office.

At Emu Plains I heard about the success of the Kairos program including our continuing ministry, and the impact it has had on the prison from their Chaplains Bernard and Fiona as well as Margaret and Pat who are members of the Regional Committee. We had the opportunity to visit with and hear the testimony of a Kairos Graduate, Mary, who shared how her life and the lives of her family have been forever changed by Kairos. The volunteers of John Morony were conducting a short-course or Weekend at the time of my visit, so the Chairman of the Australian Board of Directors, Dr. Vern Harvey, and I joined them for dinner and the team meeting which followed. While waiting for team to return we visited with their outside support team and busied ourselves in the kitchen washing and drying dishes.

In addition to the all trainings, meetings, and visits, several of our Australian volunteers made very special efforts to make sure I got to see some of the sites of Australia since it was my first trip down under. I had the opportunity to see Mount Coot-tha, the highest peak in Brisbane, located 287 meters about sea-level, and previous home to the Yuarapul Aboriginal people. We visited the Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary in Brisbane where I had the opportunity to not only see Koalas, but many of the birds and other animals who are indigenous to Australia. One evening after the training in Atherton, several volunteers took Jenny and I on a drive thru the Tablelands region of North Queensland, a fertile plateau which is part of the Great Dividing Range in Queensland, and home of the Mabi Rainforest, the Tinaroo Dam and Lake Tinaroo, and the Curtain Fig tree one of the largest and oldest and rarest trees in Australia. We had the opportunity to ride a glass-floored Skyrail Train from Kuranda to Cairns on my way back to the airport for our trip to Sydney. The Skyrail travels through the rainforest and offers amazing views of waterfalls and the terrain as you travel down the mountain to Cairns, providing a much more scenic view to get to the airport. And on our one free day in Sydney, we got to visit the beautiful harbor and all its sites including the opera house and its famous bridge.

Finally, on my trip home, I met a couple in the Sydney airport from Lubbock, Texas. They were in Australia site seeing, but as we talked I learned they go to Sunday school with several Kairos volunteers.

What Does the Front Row Get You?

It is amazing how often we get stressed over deadlines, projects, personal battles and even the things we feel positive God anointed and called us to do for Him. Okay, let me just say it out loud—It is astounding how on edge we can get in Kairos when preparing to serve on team. Sometimes that second stage of the four stages of group dynamics (Power & Control) is heavy in play—stirring internally and on full display outwardly. It’s often not the team members we are wrestling with for control; it’s actually the God who called us into this ministry that we are fighting. I wonder how many times I’ve missed the answer to an issue because I have failed to acknowledge God. Maybe like Jacob, I am wrestling with Him for something He has already put in place for me.

Psalms 46:10, “*Be still and know that I am God...*” is a widely quoted verse for calming the troubled soul. Many tend to think this verse means to take recess or to relax in who God is. While this verse encourages us who believe in God to consider who He really is, reading this complete psalm paints the true picture of what is fully being said. Verse 10 is actually more of a wake-up call to be in wonderment or struck by the awesomeness of God than a gentle call to rest. Taking time out to meditate on Scripture and be silent with listening ears toward God is mentioned through the Scriptures, but this command, “Be still...” is written in the time of distress, great hostility and war. Verse 10 has something to say to both the enemies of God and the people of God. Instead of interpreting “*be still*” as a

gentle suggestion, the meaning in this psalm lends itself more to: “**terminate struggling**” or “**stop**” and more specifically in this context “**stop fighting,**” which is directed toward the enemies of the people of God. The children of God should interpret the command for themselves to read more like: ‘**snap out of it,**’ ‘**wake up,**’ ‘**stop fearing**’ and acknowledge who your God is; be in awe of Him, He has already taken care of the battle!

We can get so bogged down with how enormous the task is that we forget the colossal size of our God. As one gospel song writer wrote;

“While we’re trying to figure it out, God’s already worked it out”.

I love the powerful yet simplistic way this scripture is stated in The Message. It reads:

“Step out of the traffic! Take a long, loving look at me, your High God, above politics, above everything.”

When we take time to really look at God (our Father) in His greatness, the work or the battle we’re in becomes so minuscule in comparison.

KAIROS TRAINING

Advanced Kairos Training is for Kairos Inside, Kairos Outside, and Kairos Torch volunteers who are in or will be in a Weekend leadership role, including Advisory Council or State Chapter positions, anywhere within the Kairos program.

Advanced Kairos Training gives the who, what, and why of the Kairos ministry. **Kairos policy requires that all Weekend leaders must have completed the entire training course 12 to 24 months prior to leading a Weekend.**

PRINCIPLE STATEMENTS CONCERNING ADVANCED KAIROS TRAINING EXPENSES

1. All Advanced Kairos Trainings are essentially free to any and all attendees. However, paying the expenses of an attendee for training is borne by the state sending its volunteers to a training in or out of its local state. This means that all Advisory Councils or State Chapter Committees should be budgeting for any training expenses deemed necessary for their future Weekend Leaders or other attendees that the Advisory Council or State Chapter Committee wants to attend.
2. Advisory Councils or State Chapter Committees should encourage their volunteers (who may have been used to paying out of their own pocket previously to a Host State) to make their donations to their local Advisory Council instead to help build the budget to allow for more volunteers to attend trainings.

Be Sure to Bring Your Program Manual With You to Training!

You must complete the entire Advanced Kairos Training in order to receive your certificate and become a Weekend Leader.
