## 2017 Annual Conference Planning is Underway!



The 2017 Kairos Annual Conference provides an excellent opportunity for education, networking, inspiration, and worship.

This year's conference will be held in lovely Peachtree City, GA at the Hilton Peachtree City Hotel and Conference Center from July 25 - July 29.

The first part of the week (Tuesday and Wednesday) is focused on business meetings for the Board of Directors and International Council. Thursday is designated for State Chair meetings, and Board and International Council committee meetings. The conference events officially kick off Thursday evening with a general session and then continue with six

sessions with seven workshops each through Friday and Saturday. Don't forget to attend the morning worship sessions to start the day off right!

The theme of the 2017 Annual Conference is "**Being Present.**" Kairos is a ministry of presence wherever our work is, it's about demonstrating God's love through our actions and through coming back - **Being Present!**

It continues to be exciting times for Kairos Prison Ministry and we see God at work all of the time. As we approach the midyear mark for 2017, we look back and compare 41 years of ministry with the past 6 months. It continues to amaze me when I see what God is doing at Kairos!

- We see three programs within the ministry running very similar to their original concepts and dramatically impacting individuals, family connections, local community (both inside and outside the prison), and volunteers.

- We see wonderful, dedicated volunteers who are giving their time, talent, and treasures to Kairos.

- We see leadership training as volunteers move into various roles, along with formal team training, Advanced Kairos Training, and Advisory Council Training.

- We see teams coming together through team formation meetings to bond spiritually and personally so they can demonstrate this same development of community to those impacted by incarceration.

- We see the spiritual health of the ministry both as a body and as individuals continuing to grow as we focus on prayer, His Word, and

His leadership in the ministry we serve.

- And we see growth of the Kairos ministry in new Advisory Councils, new states being reviewed, new countries requesting Kairos, new volunteers being added to our teams, and new opportunities coming to us each day.

As we move forward sharing the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ to those impacted by incarceration, we will continue to focus on

these items above. In 2017 we are fine-tuning how we conduct the entire Kairos program, which is the Weekend + Continuing Ministry. We know the Weekend is only the beginning, and as our founder said, the real heart of Kairos is the work after the Weekend. As we are known as the ministry that comes back - where we are helping them grow in their own prayer, walk, and accountability - so that each day they are forming their own community without us.

We also see strength in enhancing the connections between the Programs to link in the positive impact on family relationship and growth by the person incarcerated (Kairos Inside or Kairos Torch) and the women in their lives on the outside (Kairos Outside). We

## A Simple Way to Prove that “You Are Not Alone”


I have been part of the Kairos team as Men’s Coordinator for about 90 days. I try not to overanalyze anything, but I can see that Kairos’ strength is in its volunteers, and it works because of volunteers. You all do amazing things based on **Listen, Listen, Love, Love**. I hope to do my job based on your example!

There are so many things that I see you do very well, and then there are things that we can all improve upon. We have tried to make those items Workshop topics at the Annual Conference in July. I am not taking much credit, as the topics were mostly in place before I started. However, of those topics, I have already been asked questions about “The Importance of Continuing Ministry,” “How to ‘do’ Agape,” the “Importance of Clergy” in Kairos, and “How to Improve the Impact of our Advisory Council,” just to name a few!

During every Kairos Inside Weekend, I am always shocked that some talks ‘get to me’... you know, the ones that you can feel and have a reaction to when you hear them, no matter how many times you have heard them before? One of those for me is “You Are Not Alone.” It happens every time. Before you psychoanalyze me, please admit that community is as important to you as it is to me!

God becomes real to all of us through other people. I am humbled when I find out someone has been praying for me. I am shocked that somebody loves me. Put yourself in an inmate's shoes and imagine what it is like to hear and sense the truth about not being alone, when you feel utterly alone. These truths are communicated in part through Agape, personal sacrifice on someone else’s part so someone can become more open to God’s loving embrace.

Agape...those prayer chains, posters, and letters from other communities are so important. They are used to crack the door to God’s love. They send the message that “You Are Not Alone” and that you really do fit in this community and are a part of it without even doing anything. Because of that, I would like for you to think about getting more links on your chains, more posters, and more general agape letters from other communities. I have been on Weekends when chains were short. I have been there when the chains were long. Guess which one showed that “You Are Not Alone” in an extravagant way?

I can’t help much with your chains, other than to beg you to get people to pray for you and the Weekend. I can, however, help show you how to get Agape letters from other places. Visit the [www.mykairos.org](http://www.mykairos.org) website, and click on Kairos Kalendar. At the top is a link titled: “Agape Contacts for Upcoming Weekends.” If you click on the link, you will get an Excel spreadsheet with email addresses of Agape contacts for upcoming Kairos Weekends. You can copy the cells in the column with email addresses and paste them into the TO line of your email, attach your Agape letters and hit send. The result: You will be loved and get Agape in return.

Look closely, and you will notice that several of the Weekends have no Agape e-mail addresses listed. This is easily preventable! When you register your Weekend, include the Agape contact email so that you too can get Agape for your Weekend. This simple act will show your Kairos guests that “They Are Not Alone.”

## Staying on Common Ground—Becoming the Unified Body of Christ



I was a Kairos volunteer for many years before I joined the staff. The thing that drew me to Kairos, and kept me coming back all those years, was the ecumenism of the ministry.

Kairos is the only ministry that I have been involved in where I have consistently seen the unified body of Christ work together. In Kairos it does not matter whether you are Baptist, Episcopalian, Catholic, Anglican, Pentecostal, Nondenominational, Methodist, or any other Christian denomination. We avoid any practice that is denominationally-specific or divisive; staying focused on the thing we all hold in common – the transforming love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ.

I love to see the expressions on the faces of our Participants and Guests when we introduce ourselves the first night and they discover how many different denominations and churches are represented in the room. I have often had someone ask me how all of the volunteers get along since we are from so many different churches. I tell them we get along because we don't focus on what makes us different – we focus on what we have in common, which is our belief in Jesus Christ and the love, hope, and faith that we have all found in Him.

As we all know, Kairos is about love. Not just any love but the love of Christ delivered in wave after wave by God's people, our volunteers, as we serve humbly, selflessly, and sometimes invisibly thereby becoming "living agape" to our Participants and Guests, and to other volunteers.

The ecumenical/interdenominational nature of the Kairos ministry offers both spiritual and practical advantages, but also imposes important limitations on us as we serve within our ministry's programs.

Ministering within an ecumenical or interdenominational setting requires sacrifice. When serving in Kairos, volunteers must respect the personal and spiritual practices of others. We must avoid any criticism of other's beliefs, and in return, they must avoid criticizing our beliefs. In Kairos we present only broad-based, mainstream Christ teachings, and avoid any practices that are specific to one denomination or which are divisive. We don't ask volunteers to give up any denominational practices that they hold dear; we just don't do them while ministering Kairos.

Continuing Ministry magnifies our love for Jesus Christ. We must also remember to praise the Lord at all times for the diversity of our volunteers who constantly bring the common message of Christ to incarcerated men, women, youth, their families, and those they work with them so that will become loving and productive citizens of their communities.

## Be the Example. Our Youth Are Watching.

**“Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.**

Proverbs 22:6

Children are like a blank canvas. Those that come along and begin painting on that canvas give direction and guidance to the youth in a way that will affect and shape their lives into adulthood.

Making imprints on the canvas of young impressionable hearts is often carried out when those adults that they admire and look up to, walk out of their lives. We may not know how much influence we have in their lives, but make no mistake about it, youth are shaped in profound ways by how adults around them react to their environment.

As an example: Jenkins felt very disappointed with his mentee for fighting with another youth that he said disrespected him. Jenkins decided he would confront his mentee and let him know that his behavior was not acceptable. As Jenkins began addressing his mentee, he became more and more agitated with each word he spoke. Finally, he asked his mentee why he always responded with anger.

Surprised by Jenkins line of questioning, his mentee replied, “I’m not angry, I was just dealing with the situation the way I’ve seen you respond to those you don’t agree with. You’ve always seemed to get people off your back by displaying anger, so I thought I would try it as well.”

It was at that moment Jenkins realized his actions over-shadowed his words, and if he was going to

teach the proper way to address conflict resolution, he had to live his talk.

There are many issues in today’s world that generate tension, conflict and opposing viewpoints. Anger seems to be the most prevalent display for handling those disagreements these days. From world leaders to parents, anger seems to dominate our responses to life’s challenges. Youth have been watching our actions and have learned that our extreme behavior has drawn attention from near and far.

Recently, I was asked to speak to a large group of adults on how to de-escalate violence in the lives of the youth in this country. In preparation, I began to study why we are experiencing such a heightened sense of anger and rage across this country. My research took me to how today’s adults communicate and express their disappointment and disapproval. In recent years, we have become a people that no longer seek resolution or restoration that is beneficial to everyone. The world’s language has become divisive, self-serving and often mean spirited.

God’s Word gives us a very different perspective on the how to handle one another. Colossians 4:6 says: ***Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone.*** However, we are not to just speak with grace but to live it out as well...to not only be hearers of God’s word but doers.

If we find ourselves surrounded by angry youth or angry people in general, let’s take a good look at ourselves and see what kind of example we are setting. After all, we are that “***...city set on a hill (that) cannot be hidden.***” Matthew 5:14

But these Kairos volunteers fed me with the Word of God, and now I hunger after Him. I will be forever grateful to Kairos for showing me the way to freedom is through the cross of Christ."

After serving as a Methodist Minister in churches across LA, Rev. Tom "retired" to even more work in God's vineyard. Tom served on the very first Kairos Christian Prison Ministry teams in 1993, and for 20 years thereafter, he refused to let anything keep him away from this ministry to which God called him...A constant encourager to the team and prisoners alike, Tom never tired in bringing God's love and light to those lost in the darkness of prison. God used Tom to show them the way. Tom treated each day of his 90 plus years as an opportunity to serve others. May it be so for all of us.

Tom was my mentor and my friend. He will continue to be my inspiration for what one man can do in "retirement"! May God comfort Tom's large family of which he was always so proud. Tom would want

them to know that he is safe at home."



On April 6, 2017, Kairos of Texas was presented the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (“TDCJ”) Restorative Justice Award during the Governor’s 2017 Criminal Justice Volunteer Service Award program.

Advanced Kairos Training is for Kairos Inside, Kairos Outside, and Kairos Torch volunteers who are in or will be in a Weekend leadership role, including Advisory Council or State Chapter positions, anywhere within the Kairos program. Advanced Kairos Training gives the what, who and why of the Kairos ministry. **Kairos policy requires that all Weekend leaders must have completed training 12 to 24 months prior to leading a Weekend and before they serve as Observing Leader.**

### PRINCIPLE STATEMENTS CONCERNING ADVANCED KAIROS TRAINING EXPENSES

1. All Advanced Kairos Trainings are essentially free to any and all attendees. However, paying the expenses of an attendee for training is borne by the state sending its volunteers to a training in or out of its local state. This means that all Advisory Councils or State Chapter Committees should be budgeting for any training expenses deemed necessary for their future Weekend Leaders or other attendees that the Advisory Council or State Chapter Committee wants to attend.
2. Advisory Councils or State Chapter Committees should encourage their volunteers (who may have been used to paying out of their own pocket previously to a Host State) to make their donations to their local Advisory Council instead to help build the budget to allow for more volunteers to attend trainings.

***With the implementation of the Weekend Leadership Track, an Observing Leader must attend the entire Advanced Kairos Training in order to receive their certificate and serve as a Weekend Leader.***
